## Live by the Sword, Die by the Gun: Thematic Commonality and Divergence in Japanese and American Cinema

A Directed Study Proposal Spring 2022

teacher: Ned Gallagher

This directed study will introduce the field of cinema studies while exploring the mythologies of **samurai** and **Western** genres on celluloid. Unpacking the work of iconic directors such as Akira Kurosawa and John Ford, a rigorous viewing schedule of 15 films over the course of ten weeks in the spring term will be supplemented by textual material, discussion sessions, and regular writing assignments.

The term will begin with readings to introduce key concepts in film studies—terminology and techniques—as well as prevalent critical approaches used in studying cinema.

Films generally will be screened twice a week. (Most are available via streaming on Kanopy, available to all members of the Choate community via the Andrew Mellon Library.)

Discussions (which might be arranged outside the class day if no common open block can be identified) will consider technical and thematic elements of each week's films.

During the spring each student will compile a portfolio of five 2–3 page critical reviews with reference to film terminology and techniques, and to the themes of the course, with each essay focusing on a particular film or on a thematically linked pair of films (e.g., Seven Samurai and The Magnificent Seven, or Yojimbo and A Fistful of Dollars. There will be seven such opportunities to write, so each student can choose which two weeks to skip an essay.

For a final project, each student will identify a film of his/her choice to screen, write about, and present to the group, placing it in the context of themes and approaches identified throughout the term.
